

RICHMOND CITY COUNCIL

March 12, 2002

The regular meeting of the Richmond City Council was held at the Community Building on March 12, 2002. The meeting began at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Kip Panter was in the chair and the opening prayer was offered by Allen Lundgreen.

The following members were in attendance: Allan Lundgreen, Leslie Erickson and Cordell Johnson.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Discussion was held on Black and White dates for the rodeo queen contest. It will be held on Saturday, May 11th at 4:00.

Shirley Whitman: I would like to talk about the sports program. There are many problems pertaining to how the program is being run.

Mayor: I think we need to seriously look into reorganizing the program. We will wait until LD gets his personal matters under control and then we will approach him about making some changes.

Resolution 2002-2, Wastewater Planning

Marlowe: There are some problems that need to be discussed with Cordell regarding the Municipal Wastewater Planning Program referring to pages regarding effluent and influent information. We need to get an emergency response plan in operation for the lagoons. I will look into the prices for a winch and a tripod.

- ** A motion to accept Resolution 2002-2 Municipal Wastewater Planning Program which says 1. The City of Richmond hereby informs the Water Quality Board the following actions were taken by the council: A. Reviewed the Municipal Wastewater Planning Program Report for 2001, which is attached to the Resolution: B. Have taken all appropriate actions necessary to maintain effluent requirements contained in the UPDES Permit (if applicable) 2. This resolution will automatically become historic on the first day of July 2003 was made by Cordell, seconded by Allen and the vote was unanimous.

Marlowe: A complaint by some citizens about visibility on the corner of main and state by the Post Office need to be addressed. I will talk to the owners of It Fize, the business directly across from the City Office about parking cars to close to the intersection. We should not have any cars parked in the first two spots on that north west corner. We will temporarily paint the spots red and then permanently paint them with No Parking when the weather permits.

The Wastewater Treatment Pond upgrade was discussed.

Marlowe: William J Haldane, regional manager of the Pond Doctor sent me a letter and he recommends that a pond doctor Model SS unit be installed in each of our primary lagoons. These units operate solely on solar power and require no external electrical power. Based on their calculations and experience, the proposed units have treatment capacity to allow the city to grow and increase the current influent daily flow of 0.375 million gallons per day to 0.5 million gallons per day at a waste concentration of 284 mg/l. They estimate that the cost of new aerators would be about \$1,000 per horsepower plus the cost of installation. The lease for a 60-month lease is about .02, making the lease payment for the proposed Pond Doctor units about \$837 per month for five years. At the end of the lease, we would own the units. There is no penalty for paying off the lease prior to the lease term. To buy 2 reconditioned units would cost \$41,840.00

Cordell: I would like Marlowe to call the Pond Doctor and get them to come up for a discussion or demonstration. We now have the ordinance on pretreatment. I think we should get going on it. We could put the windmills down in Pond 3 and Pond 4 and the Pond Doctors in Pond 1 and Pond 2.

Council Reports

Cordell: I think we need to seriously thing about increasing the water and sewer rates \$1.00 per month per year so we can continue to cover anticipated new equipment. I really feel strongly about it.

The Council opened the bid on the grader which was received from Allied Construction and Development for \$400. This bid was rejected because the rubber tires on it are worth more than the bid.

The Council decided to postpone the Justice Court Salary review until next meeting.
