

RICHMOND CITY COUNCIL

April 9, 2002

The regular meeting of the Richmond City Council was held at the Community Building on April 9, 2002. The meeting began at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Kip Panter was in the chair and the opening prayer was offered by Kim Christensen.

The following members were in attendance: L.D. Bowcutt, Kim Christensen, Allen Lundgreen and Cordell Johnson. Leslie Erickson was excused.

Jeremy Winn presented the EMT report.

Jeremy: Robyn has submitted her resignation to the mayor as the President of the EMT's. She is going to take off one month and see how she feels about things. We had 2 calls each month for January, February, March and April for a total of 8 calls. We have three people in the EMT class. With these three new EMT's we now will have 11. The new ones will receive training soon.

Mayor: It's true that Robyn has submitted her letter of resignation. I discussed it with her and encouraged her to stay. We agreed that she would take a month off, as Jeremy has told us, and then she will make a final decision at that time. Robyn has done a great job and I hope she will reconsider.

Beth Skidmore, Justice of the Peace, came to report to the Council.

Beth: For the quarter ending March 2002 we had 139 new cases filed. The assessment to the state was \$1,446.98 and the City received \$6,234.39 for a total of \$7,681.37.

Mayor: Bruce Jorgenson would like us to know that he really appreciates Beth and her work in the judicial system.

Members of the Richmond City Youth Council came to report to the Council.

Kristin Sherner, Jamie Smith, Korine Watterson, Stephanie Griffin and Kaylene Brown.

Kristin: Eleven members of the Youth Council attended the Youth Council Conference at Utah State. It was really good.

Jamie: I went to the X Games. We had assignments. We had to set up a mousetrap and set it with our eyes closed. This was to teach about team work.

Korine: I went to a course called Starring Youth. I learned that as individuals everyone has a big role in the Youth Council as a whole. Everyone is important.

Kristin: We went to a concert put on by John Smith. It was a lot of fun. There were lots of ideas for service projects. These and service projects would include everyone in town, making the town more diverse. It was a great experience.

Ann Bowcutt: This is a good program. The Council had a great time and learned a lot.

Marlowe: Martin A. Neel, 17 years old (our employee Martin's son) would like to rent the Community Building for a rock concert on April 26. The concert would end at 12 midnight.

L.D.: It would need adult supervision. A deposit would need to be made just like anyone else.

Mayor: I think it would be a good idea if he would come to City Council and make a presentation and let us ask him a few questions about it.

Marlowe: I will pencil him in for April 23rd.

Marlowe: The plumbing has been repaired at the Relic Hall. The men have a schedule of things to do. Our water heater went out at the Community Building for the new restrooms. The warranty was for one year, which expired this past March.

Mayor: Have we received back the interlocal agreement with the County?

Marlowe: No. I will call Lynn Lemon's office and get the status.

Kim: We will try to resurface 2nd east from main street to the cemetery this summer. I think the double chip roads have done well.

Deputy Report – Brandon Douglas

Brandon: Citations have gone up recently and speeding tickets in the school zone are also up. I talked to Jan Gilbert and she said the morning shift is the worst time. I will see if we can have someone there in the mornings. I also talked to Jan and we think the signs warning the people about the school crossing should be moved 15 to 20 feet farther down the road.

Mayor: UDOT has instructed us that we can't move those out any farther for some reason.

Brandon: What if we used temporary road bumps during school crossing time. It would alert them that the school crossing is ahead. I have the proposal for the new jail. When is Black and White Days?

Marlowe: Black and White is May 13 – 18. We would like your assistance during that time.

Brandon: We will plan on being there especially Thursday and Friday Night and then Saturday for the Horse Show.

A Public Hearing was held for the Annexation of Abbott-Webb property Cherry Creek Heights Subdivision. The following people were in attendance: Terrie Wierenga, Brent Webb, Charlene Webb, Stacey Andrus, Mayor Kip Panter, Boyd Lewis, Marlowe Adkins, L.D. Bowcutt, Allen Lundgren, Cordell Johnson, and Kim Christensen

Brent Webb: I have been asked by people who we are affecting with this annexation, if it will affect their property taxes.

Mayor: It may affect the land value and taxes of the property included in the annexation boundary.

** A motion to adopt Ordinance 2002-2 was made by L.D. Bowcutt, seconded by Cordell Johnson and the vote was unanimous. The Ordinance says "An Ordinance to annex certain described land into the corporate limits of Richmond City, County of Cache, State of Utah

1. The land, currently jointly owned by Brent Webb and Michael E. Abbott dba Deer Flats Estate LLC (also referred to as Cherry Creek Heights in some documents) is hereby and herewith annexed into the corporate limits of the City of Richmond, County of Cache, State of Utah.
2. The legal description of said land is:
 - a. Beginning at the center of Section 23, Township 14 North, Range 1 East of the Salt Lake Base and Meridian, said point being on the existing Richmond City Corporate Limit line and running thence East 2640 feet, more or less, to the East Quarter of said Section 23; thence South 1080 feet, more or less, along the East line of said Section 23, to a point on said Corporate limit line; thence following said Corporate limit line for the following 2 courses (1) West 2640 feet, more or less; (2) north 1980 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning. Containing 120 acres, more or less.
 - b. Said land will be zoned A-10 per Chapter 12-217-5 of the Code of Revised Ordinances of Richmond (1975, adopted 1976) as established by Ordinance 2001-9 dated the 13th of November 2001.

Mike Abbott: We have received permission to dump any excess water in the corner lot, which is owned by Demoy Webb. We would like to run a drain line on the south side of the road down to that property. I think the Burningshams are an integral part of this equation. They need to be willing to hook their excess water into this line. We have the equipment to run the line, if the City could help with the pipe which should be 6" or 8".

Cordell: My concern is that this will only be a temporary fix and we need a permanent fix. This amount of money is quite a bit and so I think it should be a permanent fix.

Mayor: Would it be o.k. with the Council if Cordell and I get with Mike and Brent and make a decision by the next Council meeting. The council agreed.

Ordinance 2002-3

Marlowe: I handed this ordinance out 2 weeks ago. I have not changed it since then.

** A motion to adopt Ordinance 2002-3 which says "An ordinance establishing under Title 10-000 a new Chapter 10-428 of the Code of Revised Ordinances of Richmond (1975, adopted 1976) governing the

rules and procedures associated with any trash containers owned, leased, or otherwise under the jurisdiction of the Richmond City Corporation” was made by Cordell, seconded by L.D. and the vote was unanimous.

** A motion to approve Resolution 2002-3 which says “A resolution establishing usage fees associated with any trash containers owned, leased, or otherwise under the jurisdiction of the Richmond City Corporation,” was made by L.D., seconded by Cordell and the vote was unanimous.

Mayor: I will talk to Kamela about the Sports program and then get with L.D. on it tomorrow and we can make a decision of what we want to do.

A Public Hearing was held to reopen the current budget.

** A motion to reopen the current budget running from July 1, 2001 to June 30 ,2002 was made by Cordell, 2nd by L.D., and the vote was unanimous.

Boyd: We have had some adjustments on revenue and disbursements so far this budget year. They need to be addressed and added to the budget. They are as follows:
