An Invitation to Attend Time Together Workshops: Park School is sponsoring a series of workshops for parents to help children succeed in school. Richmond Soccer Sign-ups: If you have a child or children interested in playing soccer, sign-up is available at the Richmond City Office on February 1st thru 11th between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. A Saturday sign-up will take place on February 7th, same location between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. If your child did not play soccer in Richmond last year, a copy of their birth certificate must be left with the registration paperwork. CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) NEWS: The monthly training refresher session for the Richmond City CERT will be held at the City Offices on Thursday, February 19th, from 7 to 8 p.m. CERT business and training skills will be reviewed. All CERT members are invited to attend along with anyone interested in joining the team. The discussion will be centered around personal preparedness. Please bring one of the following to share: a 72-hour kit, a disaster preparedness

Rabies Clinic and Licenses for Dogs: There will a rabies clinic on Saturday, February 21st between the hours of 10 a.m. and noon at the Fire Station. You may also purchase your 2009 dog license at the same time; however, you will need two checks - one for the rabies shot, one for the license. Rabies shot is \$15. License fees will be \$5 if spayed or neutered, \$10 if not. Remember, the cost for dog licenses double on March 1st.
