General Plan Adopted

After nearly three years of work, the updated General Plan for Richmond City was adopted at the December 2013 City Council meeting. The committee started working on this in February 2011 and met monthly to conduct and review surveys, gather input from citizens, pore over maps, discuss and debate issues, and decide where and what types of future growth will occur.

The General Plan was last updated in 1999. Past and present city councils and the Planning & Zoning commission rely on it for guidance. It is not an ordinance but a guidance document for how Richmond will grow and where, what amenities to develop (parks, trails), and where roads should be constructed, among other things. Water Project Update

Boart Longyear was awarded the contract for drilling the well, the last remaining item on the water project. We will be drilling a sixteen-inch diameter well to a depth of about six hundred feet, which is considerably below adjacent private wells. Once completed, inspected, and permitted by the State, this water source will be used as necessary to keep the tank full. Drilling is expected to begin this month.
