With the warmer weather comes more outdoor activities. Please be safety aware. Small children have been seen playing in the streets with a couple of near hits being reported.

Bicyclists, walkers, and runners—please wear reflective clothing or a light when out at dawn or dusk. If you are walking or riding a non-motorized vehicle (bike, skateboard), please use the side of the road. Bikes and skateboarders, ride with the traffic flow. Walkers and joggers, do so facing oncoming traffic.

For ATV riders, Richmond City allows use on the public roads but with some requirements.

- 16 or older must have a valid driver's license and obey the speed limits.
- Not allowed on 200 West (Highway 91) or on Main Street west of 200 West. You may cross these streets in the most direct manner.
- If under 18 yrs old, operators and riders must wear proper fitted safety head gear designed for motorized vehicle use.
- Excessive mechanical noise, i.e. riding back and forth on streets, is one of the prohibited uses.

The full ordinance is found in Chapter 11-390 (ordinances are online or may be viewed at the city office).



Consumer Confidence Report

The annual Consumer Confidence Report on our city's culinary water quality will be mailed

out with the July newsletter. You may view it sooner when it is filed with the state in late June. It will be at the city office as well as posted on the city website.

Utility Fee Increases July 1

Just a reminder that the water and sewer fees will increase by \$1 each on July 1st. The Central Dispatch fee (the "CD" line on your bill) will also go up \$1 to help maintain the emergency dispatch system. These increases will be seen on the bill coming out in August.

Base rate, which covers delivery and the first 10,000 gallons, for culinary water will be \$54 per month. The base discharge rate for wastewater, which covers 15,000 gallons, will move to \$47 per month.

The current central dispatch will increase to \$3 per month.



Water and Wastewater Impact Fees

Presentations and public hearings have been held at the council meetings this year to discuss the updated Water and Wastewater Impact Fee Analysis. The proposed analysis is available at the city office and on the city website for review. This covers impact and hook-up fees for culinary water and wastewater for 2014 through 2019. Please note that the updated fee schedule will only apply to future hook-ups and DO NOT AFFECT current water/wastewater connections.

In the proposed fee schedule, the city has been divided into a north and south zone with the north zone having a higher impact fee for wastewater. Culinary water impact fees are the same throughout the city.

The council may vote to adopt this new schedule at the June 17th meeting. If you have concerns, please read the proposal and bring them to the mayor or council.
