





April is nationally recognized as Child Abuse Prevention Month. This month brings awareness to the community that abuse happens here in Cache Valley and that through support and education abuse can be prevented.

Events held in conjunction with Child Abuse Prevention Month include:

April 11, 11:30am-2:30pm Sam's Club BBQ: Join us for our 6th annual Sam's Club BBQ! Lunch will be served by the Sam's Club crew and all proceeds will be donated to the Child & Family Support Center.
