



The Federal Environmental Protection Agency and the Utah Division of Drinking Water require us to notify all users of culinary water in the Richmond system that the lead-copper standards were exceeded during the second half of calendar year 2014. What this means is that one or more residences from the 24 sampled for lead-copper content show results that exceed the established standards. **Your**

water is perfectly safe to drink! This is a formal notice as required by law.
