

Winter Weather Reminders

Winter parking restrictions are in effect. No parking on the street or City right-of-way is permitted between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. The city assumes no liability for damage to personal property that occurs when it is placed in the city right-of-way (i.e. from snow plows).



During these winter months, please move your garbage and recycle cans off the edge of the street just as soon as you possibly can after garbage/recycle pick-up. The snowplows do the best

they can to avoid striking them, but on some streets and in some of the more snowy weather it can be difficult. Your assistance is appreciated.
