
Park School Time Together

Winter Weather Reminders

Winter parking restrictions end March 31st. Until then, no parking on the street or City right-of-way is permitted between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. The city assumes no liability for damage to personal property that occurs when it is placed in the city right-of-way (i.e. from snow plows).

During these winter months, please move your garbage and recycling cans off the edge of the street just as soon as you possibly can after garbage/ recycle pick-up. The snowplows do the best they can to avoid striking them, but on some streets and in some of the more snowy weather it can be difficult. Your assistance is appreciated.



If you have a fire hydrant on your property, please clear the snow around it so it is easily accessible if the fire department needs to respond to an emergency in the area. Thanks!

Richmond City Water Purification Class

Richmond City CERT would like to invite the Residents of Richmond to a water safety training on March 24, 2016 at the Richmond City Building from 7:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. We will be hosting Max Gyllenskog who will instruct us about water safety, storage and purification procedures. Max will have various examples of purification devices that are available locally in Cache Valley.

Max Gyllenskog has a Masters of Public Health. He has 45 years experience working with water systems. He was the Director of the Cache County Health Department's water lab for 15 years. For the last five years he has worked with native communities in 20 states

and 10 countries developing safe water supplies and practices.

Anyone who is interested to learn how to prepare for disaster situations where we can lose access to clean potable water, come join the Richmond CERT Team for very informative instruction. Utility Bill Hang Tag Fee

At the city council meeting on February 16th the council adopted Ordinance 2016-1. The ordinance approves charging utility account holders a \$5.00 fee if a hang tag (non-payment notice) has to be physically placed at a residence/business due to lack of payment by an account holder. The fee will **“NOT”** be charged if the city has an active email address on file for the account holder.

The city uses the Parlant communication system to distribute information and this same system would be used to send utility account holders information when their account is delinquent. Right now about 70% of the city has signed up for the communication system and no action is required on your part. Those signed up should be receiving emails from communityresponse@richmond-utah.com.

If you are not receiving periodic emails from the city, please check your SPAM folder. In some cases email addresses ending in “@yahoo.com” are being rejected as SPAM. Please add this email to your safe recipient list.

If you have not signed up for the service and would like to, simply email the city at communityresponse@richmond-utah.com and your email address will be added to the system. The system allows for more than one email address to be added per account holder so if you want to add your spouse or someone else please let us know.

The reason for this ordinance is the city staff is very small and on average it takes 8 to 10 hours to prepare and distribute hang tag notices. If the city has an active email address on file, the notification can be sent in seconds. Your

information is securely stored and the only city staff members having access are the city recorder, mayor, and IT manager.

We encourage you to sign up for this service if you have not as potential late fees can be avoided and information can be provided in an expedient manner. If you decide to have your email address removed from the system, all you have to do is click “unsubscribe” at the bottom of the email you receive from the city and your email address is immediately removed.
