Thanks for Celebrating **National Children's Book Week** with the library. Some of the greatest books ever read (by all ages) are those written for children. Every librarian surely has a favorite pick in the children's section of the library. Our winners in the Big J's ice cream drawings were Andrew Durrant, Ashlyn Jorgensen, Olivia Schultz, Garrett Curdy, Cash and Twila Peck. 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten is a great program at the Richmond Library. It's a simple program: read aloud and share 1,000 stories with your child before they enter kindergarten. It adds up pretty quickly: 1 book a night (but what child wants to read only 1 book?) = 365 books in 1 year, 730 books in 2 years, **1,095 books in 3 years!**

If you read the same story over and over again, that counts – each and every time. If your child hears a story at story hour, that counts too. Every time you or someone else reads, sings or talks about a book or story with your newborn, infant, or toddler, it counts. Come in and pick up your information packet, which includes your reading record, and let the counting begin.

2016 Summer Reading Program begins! The theme this year's is **On Your Mark, Get Set, Read!** The Kick-off Party will be Thursday, June 9th at 10:30 AM. We invite all to come and join the fun each Thursday through July 28th - and most especially – come, get on your mark, get set, READ!
