RICHMOND CITY MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBER MID-TERM VACANCY

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN of a Midterm Mayor and City Council Vacancy in Richmond, Utah. Any person interested in serving as the Mayor or as a City Council Member and meeting the following eligibility and residency requirements is hereby invited to complete an application. The appointed Mayor and Council Member will serve through the vacated term of Mayor Michael Hall and Council Member Brad Jensen ending December 31, 2017.

Eligibility and Residency Requirements:

- 1) Candidates must be a United States citizen at time of filing for candidacy.
- 2) Candidates must be at least 18 years of age at the time of the appointment.
- 3) Candidates must be a legal resident of the municipality for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of appointment.
- 4) Candidate must be a registered voter of the municipality.

Pursuant to Utah Constitution Article IV, Section 6, any mentally incompetent person, any person convicted of a felony, or any person convicted of treason or a crime against the elective franchise may not hold office in this state until the right to vote or hold elective office is restored as provided by statute.
