Any person interested in serving as a City Council Member and meeting the following eligibility and residency requirements is hereby invited to complete an application. The appointed Council Member will serve through the vacated term of Council Member Jeff Young ending December 31, 2017.


Eligibility and residency requirements:

1. Candidates must be a United States citizen at time of filing for candidacy.
2. Candidates must be at least 18 years of age at the time of the appointment.

3. Candidates must be a legal resident of the municipality for 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the date of appointment.
4. Candidate must be a registered voter of the municipality.

Applications must be received by Wednesday, October 12, 2016 by 5:00 P.M.

Have you heard of Richmond's newest playground? A group of citizens are building Richmond's first ADA accessible playground named after Ella, a spunky 4-year-old girl who was born blind. It will be located at 602 North Cherry Creek Parkway in the Cherry Creek Heights subdivision. It is a park similar to Ryan's Place and the Whittier Community Center designed to allow children with all abilities to learn and play together.

A designer from Leather's and Associates visited with the students of Park Elementary in May to get their input for the playground. If you'd like to see what ideas the children had, please visit our site, Ellaspark.org.
