Public Hearing at next Council Meeting

The Richmond City Council will hold a public hearing on Tuesday, November 15, 2016, at the Richmond City Office Building located at 6 West Main, Richmond, Utah no sooner than 7:30 P.M. The public hearing is for the purpose of discussing the forgiving of a loan from the Capital Projects Fund to the Water Enterprise Fund.



The election this year is being done through the mail. Ballots have been mailed; they come in a white envelope with blue and red lettering.

The envelope you mail back to the county will be light blue. Please make sure you follow the instructions and sign where appropriate.

If you do not want to mail your ballot, there is a ballot box at the city office building (6 West Main) where you can stop in M-F from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM and drop off your ballot.

Ballots must be postmarked or dropped off at the city office building no later than Monday, November 7th to be counted and included. Ballots postmarked Tuesday, November 8th, will be disqualified.

Winter Parking Restrictions

The city is asking for your help in these areas:

The Winter Parking Ordinance is in effect from November 1st through March 31st.

Vehicles CANNOT be parked on city streets from 10:00 P.M. to 7:00 A.M. daily or a citation can be written. Please help us keep your vehicles safe from damage and our snowplow drivers safe as well.

Please remove your garbage can(s) from the roadside on Friday as soon as possible. The

snowplow truck drivers try to avoid hitting any of the cans at any time but sometimes it happens and we want to keep your cans undamaged and our drivers safe.

Please DO NOT push or snow blow the snow from your driveway and sidewalk into or across the city street. Also, please do not push snow from your driveway across the road into your neighbor's yard. When snow is pushed or blown into a city road it can freeze and create a hazard for motorists as well as it causes damage to the



city's snowplow trucks.

Please clear the sidewalk in front of your home and if you can, assist your neighbors in clearing theirs. The council is

always concerned about the safety of people walking. When sidewalks are not clear, people will walk in the road which can be dangerous for both motorists and those walking to their destination.

We also recommend you park your vehicles and keep other personal items off the street as far as possible. The snowplow trucks can throw snow, ice, and debris 12 to 15 feet on average from the city road and we want to avoid damage if possible.
