Winter Parking Ordinance

No overnight parking is allowed on the streets between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. This lets our snow plow operators clear snow off the entire width of the street instead of having to swing around vehicles.

The city also asks residents to move their garbage and recycling cans off the side of the street as soon as possible after the contents have been picked up.

Please don't plow snow from your driveway or sidewalk onto the street either. This can often freeze into quite a solid speed bump.
