Richmond Fire & Rescue Department

Chief Dennis Wood has announced his retirement. Chief Wood has given selflessly to the volunteer fire service community for 25 years and served as the Richmond City Fire Chief for the past three years.

Troy Hooley has been appointed as the new Fire Chief. Chief Hooley is a Firefighter/Paramedic with 25 years of service to offer our great city and department.

The Fire Department would like to send out a big thank you to Firefighter/EMT-B Derk Gilbert. Derk has lived in Richmond for 17 years and served on the Fire Department for 14 years.

Derk went above and beyond the call of duty this past month to get our new SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus) filling station installed at the fire station. This project has been in the works for an extended period of time and

has taken the combined effort of several department members to finally make it happen.

This might not sound like a big deal; however, it is a huge deal to the department. The filling station gives the department the capability of filling our air tanks here in town instead of having to take personnel and equipment out of service to go get the tanks filled at another facility. This allows us to provide better coverage and service to the residents of the city. It will also let us fill air tanks for other communities when they come to help on a mutual aid call. This allows the other departments to return to their communities and be ready to respond immediately.
